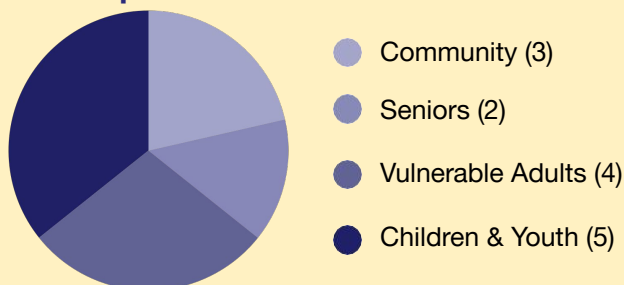

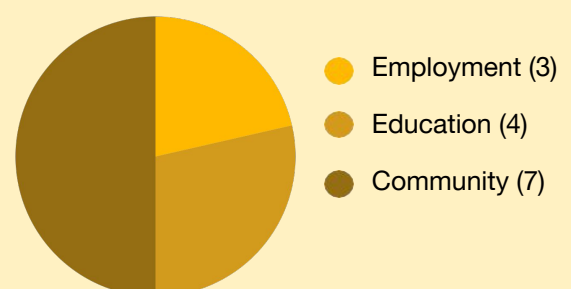
2023 Grantee Partners Selection Process
