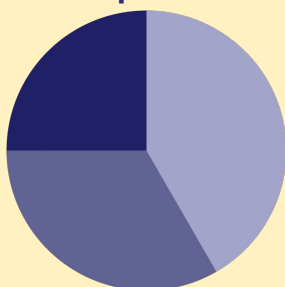

2024 Grantee Partners Selection Process

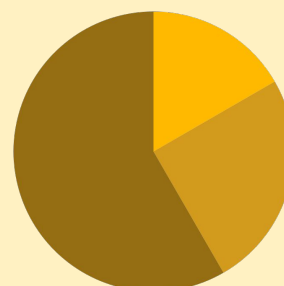
- ▶ 25 proposals were assessed by the grant committee based on the FMAS Trampoline Fund evaluation matrix.

S/N	Organisation Name	Funding Scope
1	ART:DIS	Ceramics Open Studio is a year-long project targeting 12 to 15 persons with disability (PWDs) aged 18 and above who lack job placement opportunities due to their specific needs and provide vocational training in ceramics. (https://www.artdis.org.sg/)
2	Awful Grace	Family Matters is an ongoing programme till May 2025, that aims to reconcile 13 incarcerated individuals with 26 family members (2 per family), using Restorative Practice principles and psychoeducational methods. (https://awfulgrace.org/)
3	Curious Thoughts Giving Limited	CuriousTime@SSAs (Math) is targeted at 40 preschool children (4 to 8 years old) from lower resourced families. The programme aims to equip lower resourced children with the necessary Mathematical skills and educational resources to ensure the best learning outcomes. (https://giving.curiousthoughts.sg/)
4	Daughters Of Tomorrow	The Bridges to Employment Programme aims to enhance employer engagement for 30 employers, and provide specialized support for 150 lower-income women seeking financial stability as they re-enter the workforce over a one-year period. (https://daughtersoftomorrow.org/)
5	Epworth Community Services	Project Catapult is a 15-month project supporting 25 children and youths, aged 7 to 18 years old recovering from trauma, to achieve post-traumatic growth. It aims to support them in developing life skills for better coping mechanisms, providing opportunities for talent development, assisting in setting and achieving new life aspirations, and encouraging ongoing recovery efforts. 6	Foundry	Foundry, by The Majority Trust, is a unique collective impact hub addressing the significant challenges faced by smaller social impact organisations. There is a gap in support for these organisations - they often operate in isolation, lack critical resources, and struggle to scale their impact. Foundry ensures that smaller impact organisations can thrive so that the vulnerable communities they serve can thrive too. (https://foundry.sg/)

7	Lutheran Community Care Services	Project Kaleidoscope is a year-long pilot initiative by LCCS and Society for the Promotion of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder Research and Knowledge (SPARK) to target 10 families with children aged 11 to 12 years old who have been diagnosed with ADHD. The programme aims to boost caregiver confidence in caring for children with ADHD, to foster resilience within the family unit, and to create a supportive environment for their children. 8	New Life Community Services	Steady Readers (SR) is an ongoing early intervention programme to provide customised support for 70 children aged 5 to 10 years old (K2 to Primary 4 students) from lower resourced families and/or transnational families, who struggle with reading at their academic level. (https://www.newlife.org.sg/)
9	New Life Stories	Mama Befriending is a 16-month (between September 2024 to January 2026) post-natal pilot befriending programme to support 10 incarcerated mothers who have given birth in prison. (https://www.newlifestories.org.sg/)
10	REACH Community Services Society	REACH Community Services reached out to the Least, the Lost and Lonely in the community through a variety of programmes and professional services. (https://reach.org.sg/)
11	Reading Roots	Project Sprout is a year-long structured and evidence-based literary programme with tailored interventions for 50 children from under-resourced families aged 4 to 7 years old. This early intervention programme aims to provide upstream literacy support prior to entry to primary school. (https://www.instagram.com/readingrootssg/)
12	Wild Rice Ltd	Young & Wild is a comprehensive 10-month acting programme which targets aspiring 14 to 17 young actors aged 25 to 35 years old. The programme aims to equip them with the necessary skills for a career in the creative industry and to bridge the gap between amateur productions with the professional world of theatre.
