Formed in 1973, FMAS is the standard bearer for financial markets professionals in Singapore. Their history has been inextricably linked to Singapore's emergence as a leading financial centre in the world.

Formerly known as ACI Singapore – The Financial Markets Association, the Association was renamed to Financial Markets Association of Singapore on 31st March 2021, and is affiliated with ACI – The Financial Markets Association, the global body. This Paris-based global body, Association Cambiste Internationale (ACI), has more than 13,000 international members worldwide in more than 60 countries, making it the largest international association in the wholesale financial markets. ACI was founded in France in 1955 following an agreement between foreign exchange dealers in Paris and London.

FMAS is an active participant in the ACI Global arena and with the ACI FMA Standing Committees. FMAS's Singapore members have been elected to various global committees over the years, and presently to the ACI FMA, Board of Education. FMAS is also a leading Financial Markets Training provider in Singapore, with its industry-standard, in-house training based on a training roadmap developed in partnership

with the Singapore Management University. All these underpin FMAS's commitment to the continuing education and professional development of our members, and the industry.

Over the past 27 years, FMAS has raised over \$12.6 million for the less fortunate in our society through its annual Charity Golf and Dinner event. This charity drive is widely and actively supported by our members, the dealing fraternity and financial institutions across Singapore.

In 2020, the FMAS Trampoline Fund raised \$471,000* at ACI Live Aid – Financial Markets Give Back 2020, from 131 family offices, corporate and individual donors. Through the 2020 grant call, the Fund has worked with 15 grantee partners who have served 50,755 beneficiaries. The list of 2020 grantee partners can be found on page 22.

In 2021, the FMAS Trampoline Fund raised \$806,000[^] to support 20 grantee partners with a projected reach of 55,151 beneficiaries. This report provides an update on the 2021 Fund impact.



FMAS Trampoline Fund

In partnership with FMAS, the FMAS Trampoline Fund was created to support non-profit programmes and initiatives that address the longer-term needs of vulnerable people in Singapore beyond the Covid-19 crisis, to provide a “trampoline” for these groups in uncertain times.

The Fund aims to create sustainable change in beneficiaries’ lives e.g. empowering vulnerable workers through job guidance and skills training, and supporting disadvantaged children and youth in education.

The FMAS Trampoline Fund draws inspiration (as well as its name) from Senior Minister Tharman Shanmugaratnam's "trampoline" idea — that social assistance should ultimately help those in need bounce back up.

Thus the Fund looks at supporting programmes that work with the vulnerable and disadvantaged to improve their capabilities to change their lives for the better.

The Fund supports programmes in 3 domains:

- 1 Education:** working with children and youth to build key academic and interpersonal skills;
- 2 Employment:** helping those from disadvantaged backgrounds find better jobs and build careers;
- 3 Community:** improving our collective well-being, and communal ability to support families who are striving to do better.



"I believe in the notion of a trampoline [...] If you provide help for someone who is willing to study hard; if you provide help for someone who is willing to take up a job and

work at it [...] it transforms culture. It's not just about transactions. It's not just about the size of grants. It's about keeping alive a culture where I feel proud that I own my home and I earn my own success through my job. I feel proud that I'm raising my family. OUTCOMES

The FMAS Trampoline Fund covers a diversity of beneficiaries and clients, spanning children, youth, women, working adults, and the elderly. This allows the Fund to help people who play different roles in a family unit. Since everyone in a family is connected, helping even just one family member to bounce back can catalyse an overall improvement in the family's overall situation. In this sense, the Fund's diversity helps provide multiple opportunities for people to bounce back, no matter where they are in life.

This diversity also means it is not possible to apply a single set of metrics to all grantee partners and programmes. Even so, we would like to highlight **outcomes linked to education and employment**. These two are key channels for helping people bounce back or bounce up from their current circumstances.



Getting Back on My Feet! provides an avenue for abused teenage girls to complete their academic studies in a stigma-free environment and offers ex-offenders and at-risk vulnerable individuals an opportunity to secure a sustainable livelihood, thus ensuring they will be able to support themselves and their family for the long term.

They support clients throughout their job search journey by identifying strengths, developing job search trackers and coaching interview skills among others.



A Helping Hand for Pregnant Teens

Babes Pregnancy Crisis Support Ltd - Babes Bridging Programme

The Babes Bridging Programme supports pregnant teenagers who opt for parenthood, with skills and knowledge required to gain employment and support their families. They also provide bursaries to assist the young mothers financially when they return to school.

GRANT AMOUNT: \$40,000

Beyond Social Services - Youth Want Work

Youth Want Work is a primarily youth-driven pilot programme that draws together youths from rental flat neighbourhoods who have left school, are about to graduate or are currently seeking employment. It offers services to training, job-matching, internship opportunities, networking among peers and more.




